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### ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Students in Elementary School (Kinder 4 to Grade 5) enjoy a remarkable education program consisting of English and Spanish language experiences, as well as weekly classes in Physical Education, Fine Arts (Music and Art), Technology, and Counseling.

All Elementary School classes are designed to promote a high level of interest and to develop responsible and independent lifelong learners.

Social emotional wellbeing is prioritized in all classrooms and learning spaces. Additionally, students with learning differences or individual needs work with learning specialists within and outside of the regular classroom to receive the instruction they need to learn. Our Life Centered Education program supports students with intensive cognitive and medical needs. We value and embrace all abilities in our diverse community!

Elementary leadership collaborates closely with students, teachers, and parents, actively embedding them in the learning process. This commitment extends to both academic and social-emotional domains of development.

























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## MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students in Middle School (Grades 6 to 8) learn in an integrated and exploratory environment. They navigate a challenging academic curriculum that fosters their social, emotional, and physical development.

We offer a variety of courses, including English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Language, and Geography/History. Our students receive support through various programs, such as English Language Learners (ELL), Learning Center, and Spanish Language Learners (SLL). Counseling focuses on organization and study habits, identity development, diversity and inclusion, and self-advocacy.

Our local and international educators guide Lincoln learners to inquire, reflect, and innovate. They empower them to develop critical thinking and grow as respectful, resilient, and open-minded change agents. As a result, our young learners take action through service projects, spirit weeks, and student-led assemblies. As our learners explore their uniqueness, they develop self-awareness, confidence, and an innovative spirit while cherishing the importance of friendship and collaboration.







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
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## HIGH SCHOOL

Students in high school (Grades 9 to 12) pursue a program that encourages academic and personal growth.

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Learners select a variety of courses, including English, Spanish, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, Fine Arts, Physical Education and Health, and electives, such as Computer Science, Design, and Technology.

Our Counseling Program offers support in academic and social-emotional learning, while meeting the needs of students planning to attend college or university abroad.

Our High School experience integrates the Argentine and North American-accredited diplomas, and the International Baccalaureate (IB). Most of our graduates continue their studies at universities in the United States, United Kingdom and Argentina. Additionally, many others choose different locations, such as Australia, Belgium, Canada, Colombia, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Mexico, Netherlands, South Korea, Spain and Switzerland, among other countries.

























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## ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES

The Athletics & Activities program inspires resilient and healthy individuals. We offer over 60 recreational options that allow students from all divisions to explore their passions, discover their potential, and challenge themselves.

Over 80% of our learners enroll in this program each year. Some of the activities available are Band, Choir, Theater, Dance, Creative Writing, Cooking, Model United Nations, Eco Club, Programming, Chess, Math, Reading, Lego Robotics, Gender and Sexuality Alliance (GSA), Cheer & Gymnastics, Yoga, and competitive sports (soccer, volleyball, basketball, swimming, taekwondo, tennis), among others.

Through national competitions, our Condors develop teamwork and expand their friendship network. As members of the South American Activities Conference (SAAC), we compete with international schools of the region.
