DIPLOMAS

THE LINCOLN HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

The Lincoln High School Diploma is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) to offer a U.S. High School Diploma. Students must earn 25 credits to graduate, including core academic subjects and electives. The primary language of learning is English, and courses in Spanish are offered at all levels.

THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA

All Lincoln students in Grades 11 and 12 are encouraged to pursue the full IB Diploma. This multidisciplinary programme requires the study of the humanities, at least two languages, science, mathematics and the arts. It also entails an extended essay, service and action element, and study of the theory of knowledge.

Upon successful completion of the programme and the IB exams, students receive the IB Diploma, recognized around the globe as a rigorous university preparatory qualification.

THE ARGENTINE DIPLOMA

The Bilingual Baccalaureate (Bachillerato Bilingüe) is the Argentine Ministry recognized secondary school credential (Secundaria) completed by all Lincoln students (grades 10–12). All students must be enrolled in this program which leads to an Argentine diploma.



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn 25 credits to graduate. Each year-long course is worth one credit.

ASSESSMENT

In 2021-2022, the school began to assess academic achievement using a 1-7 grade scale. Students in the class of 2022 will receive transcripts that reflect this change, with previous grades indicated using an A-F scale. Students earn credit for results of 3 and above. The school does not weight courses, average grades, rank students or calculate GPA.

COVID-19

Due to the pandemic, schools in Argentina were closed and Lincoln moved to online learning from March, 2020 until February, 2021. At that time, Lincoln returned to campus for ten weeks before closing again in April 2021 until June 12, 2021. IBDP students in the May 2021 session took the nonexam route. The school started on campus in August, 2021 for the 2021-22 school year.

LINCOLN INTERNSHIP


All Grade 11 students take part in a one-week internship sponsored by a mentor, working onsite in various industries. The Aim of the Lincoln Internship Program is to provide opportunities beyond the classroom for students to engage in learning experiences that enhance the development of real-world skill sets and mindsets. Students work in management, manufacturing, finance, hospitality, education, marketing, communications, IT, and with NGOs and Embassies.



LINCOLN IMPACT

Grade 9 and 10 students participate in the Lincoln IMPACT project, a week-long transdisciplinary project based on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Lincoln IMPACT is a personalized learning experience that allows all students to dive deep into one of the SDGs, developing executive skills in, self awareness, collaboration, data collection and analysis, communication, and research. Students work with peers across grade levels as well as representatives from the United Nations and various local agencies. The week culminates in presentations before a panel of experts from the community.
